Though Cupertino entered this stage of tournament pool play with 0 wins and 2 losses and Briarwood El Camino had rolled to a 3 and 0 record, the visitors from Cupertino frustrated their Santa Clara hosts through the first four innings, until Briarwood finally took a lead in inning five.

B-Wood's Matthew Tiendas pitched a strong first inning, allowing just a hit batter to start the game and an outfield error, but Cupertino's early chance faded with an unassisted double play by first baseman Jared Cabildo, followed by a ground out to second base.

In the bottom of inning one, Cupertino starter Jon Ringer rang up the first three of his 10 strikeouts, stranding Jacob Horne who had singled to center.

The 2nd inning also kept runs off the scoreboard, though Briarwood's Toby Esqueda rocketed a line drive off Ringer's foot that paused the game as the pitcher absorbed the pain. Ringer rebounded to get all 3 outs that inning by strikeout, raising his total to 6 in the scoreless duel.

Cupertino broke through the joint shutout with 2 runs in inning three, plating Phillip Long and Kevin Gong with a blend of three hits, a walk and a defensive error to go up 2 to 0.

Briarwood bounced back to tie the game in the bottom of the 3rd with 2 runs of their own, as Jared Cabildo landed a single to left that scored Tyson Mitchell and Noah Pang. As the game re-tied, the fans for both sides increased cheering and expectations for victory heightened.

The 4th inning was uneventful as Cupertino went down 1-2-3 in the top and Briarwood stranded a lone runner on first in the bottom.

Matthew Tiendas faced the top of the order for the third time as inning five launched. Though Jon Ringer led off with a single to right field, Matt reeled off three straight strikeouts against Cupertino to end the top of the 5th and keep the game tied at 2 each.

Briarwood's 12-year olds came to the plate in the bottom of the 5th inning hoping to end their home field careers with enough runs to guarantee victory. Leading off, Noah Pang delivered some family memories by driving a 1-0 pitch to the base of the centerfield fence for a clean double. Jared Cabildo then lined an 0-1 pitch to the left field grass, sending Noah home for a Briarwood lead of 3 to 2.

The rally continued with a single to right by Age 12 Toby Esqueda. And League Age 11 Brayden Rosa drove in two insurance runs with a clean single to right that pushed Briarwood ahead 5 to 2 and spurred fans to dance in the first base stands.

Briarwood Reliever Jacob Horne (age 12) concluded his home field career with a smooth 6th inning, finishing the game with a four pitch strikeout of Cupertino's last hitter to wrap up Briarwood's 5 to 2 win.

The first inning saw no score despite each team getting runners on base. Westside got one player to second base in the top of the 2nd, but nothing more and the game stayed at no score after one and a half innings.

Briarwood El Camino Little League lore received a new paragraph in the bottom of the second as Jacob Horne unloaded a one-out full count clean triple to the centerfield fence. And Toby Esqueda earned a hero's welcome as he ran home after depositing a 2-0 pitch deep over the left centerfield fence for a home run. Surrounded by back claps and high fives, Toby and Jacob jogged to the dugout as the scoreboard clicked to a Briarwood 2 to 0 lead.

Defense took over in the next couple innings as neither team could push across a run, with Westside sending just seven players to bat and Briarwood sending just six players to hit.

In the top of the 5th, Westside's Matt Conklin led off with a walk on a 3-1 pitch. Cowper Anderson fouled out on a drifting fly to right chased down by Mateo Escobedo. Orlando Lewis moved Matt Conklin to 2nd on a fielder's choice grounder to second. And Sam Sylvia edged out a long throw from 3rd to earn a two-out single that plated Matt Conklin and put Westside on the scoreboard. Mike Forney was safe on a two-out error at third base and that ended Jared Cabildo's day on the mound at 83 pitches. With Westside fans in a frenzy and Briarwood fans nervous, reliever Noah Pang took the hill and walked Jake Martin on four pitches to load the bases with two outs and just a one-run lead at 2-1 for Briarwood. After six pitches, JT Mlnarik lifted a single to left field that scored Sam Sylvia to tie the game at 2 each, and moved each runner forward just one base. Austin Sands battled the count to 3 and 2 and then fouled off pitch six to keep the count full. Noah Pang reached deep and threw a strike that Austin popped above the pitcher's mound. As the ball dropped definitively into Noah Pang's glove, Westside was glad to have tied the game, but apprehensive about leaving three players on base without scoring more.

The bottom of the 5th saw Brayden Rosa lead off with a full count walk that lifted Briarwood fans into cheers while Westside's supporters shifted anxiously. Tyson Mitchell earned a walk on a 3-1 pitch, and the potential winning run was just two bases away for Briarwood. After a strikeout for the first out of the inning, Noah Pang took a first pitch fastball to his side to load the bases and bring Jared Cabildo to the plate. Jared launched a 1 strike pitch deep to centerfield that caught empty green and rolled quickly to the fence, posting first Brayden, then Tyson, then Noah across home for a Briarwood 5-2 lead. As Briarwood's fans danced, Mateo Escobedo drilled a single to center that pushed Jared to third base. Cooper Billings earned a 3-1 walk, loading the bases again, with a chance for Briarwood to put the game out of reach with Briarwood's 2nd inning hero Jacob Horne stepping in to hit. Westside's Sam Sylvia rose to the challenge and threw two strikes, then one ball, then got Jacob to ground to first for the third out of the inning that left the margin at 5-2 for Briarwood.

The top of the sixth was all Noah Pang as he picked up a called strike 3 on a 2-2 pitch for out one, a pop to third on a 1-2 pitch and a swinging strike 3 on a 1-2 pitch to end this chapter of the baseball battles of Santa Clara in Briarwood's favor.
